The IFAA Past President Report –Felipe Hoetz, ALOSI, Chile

2015 began with interesting industry news, for example, in the UK, the Insurance Bill 2015 received royal assent on February 12, becoming law as Insurance Act 2015. By overhauling certain fundamental areas of UK insurance law it applies to both insurance and reinsurance contracts. The reforms will come into force in August 2016, giving the industry a period of 18 months to prepare.

In addition, at the third UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in Sendai, Japan, the trend of growing economic losses from global natural catastrophes by looking at nearly 20 years of historical events was examined. AIR* normalised these losses based on today's conditions including changes in population, wealth, and urbanisation of catastrophe prone areas, finding that they oscillate around a baseline value of US\$240 billion. According to preliminary results of this catastrophe modelling study, this figure is expected to triple to US\$750 billion over the next 15 years. These examples highlight the importance of preparing ourselves via educational activities such as IFAA's 6th Educational Conference on Catastrophe Claims. On this occasion, the focus was on Latin America and we chose Miami because it has become the regional hub for the Latin American re/insurance market. Delegates benefited from the wide range of experts and networking possibilities. It was our pleasure meeting you there!
